





It's not organized, there's no committee, and there's not even a Facebook page for this event. Yet, the Wednesday night before Thanksgiving gathering on 2nd St. has become prevalent enough for us to call it a holiday tradition. It's an unofficial high school reunion night for the young adults of East Long Beach home for the holidays.

From current college attendees to recent graduates, 20-somethings find themselves catching up with old acquaintances on the eve of Thanksgiving. We asked the best source we could think of to expound on the subject.

Eric Johnson has been a co-owner of Legends since 2012. Born and raised in Long Beach, Eric attended Rogers Middle School, Wilson Classical High (class of 1992), and CSULB.

He understands the importance of what Legends means to Long Beach and the Belmont Shore area, especially during the holidays. When asked about coming to 2nd Street the night before Thanksgiving, Eric responded that he indeed used to participate.

"My friends and I would come down to 2nd Street and hit up the local bars such as Shannon's, Acapulco Inn, and



Legends. It was great getting to come back home and see family and friends all in one area, together again."

Not much has changed in the 20 years since Eric took part in the meetups.

Today, Long Beach natives continue the holiday tradition of meeting on 2nd Street and enjoying a few drinks with family members, friends, and significant others. "The atmosphere and energy is very similar to when I used to go out with friends at night. It signals the start of the holiday season and is definitely a special time of the year," Eric explains.

23 year-old Chris Hubbard lives in Chicago post-grad, but has loved the tradition since turning 21. "It's always great seeing and catching up with people you haven't seen in years - high school classmates, old teammates, childhood friends. It's like the Super Bowl of going out, you know everyone is going to be there."

From Brooklyn, New York, 26-year-old Torri Kreinheder echoes the sentiment. "It's really nice to see old acquaintances from high school you may have shared a class or two with but found it hard to

stay in touch. It brings you back to a place where home in Long Beach felt different than it does now."

The holiday tradition is one of Legends' busiest nights and Eric says he feels nostalgic when he sees the crowd of all ages enjoying animated conversations, fresh beer and buckets of wings alongside family members and friends.



From that day forward we would spend time each year with some of those Naples friends to celebrate the holiday, our wedding anniversary and the USC/UCLA game. In 1982 we came back to Naples permanently when we bought our home. Dorothy in the Wizard of Oz has it right when she repeats, "There is no place like home."

While the quote may not directly be about cancer, the way Dr. Meinberg constructs her chapters makes each quote resonate powerfully with the reader.

A lot of what Dr. Meinberg preaches has to do with selfcare. And, while the book is about beating cancer, it also inspires any reader to be proactive in life. The positive messages are equally useful in any area of struggle.

In the back, Dr. Meinberg cites her meticulous list of references so when you're done reading her book you can dive into an amazing reading list! A Cluster of Cancers is a fantastic read, guaranteed to put a smile on your face, even if you are feeling down. Dr. Meinberg writes in a clear and uplifting



way, no doubt because that's the kind of people she and her husband are.



I always get a little wistful each year in January, when I see our beloved "Trees in the Bay" getting staged at the Marine Stadium boat launch to be tucked away - only to become excited when they come back out in the Fall! These iconic, 18-foot water-floating trees hold so many memories for Long Beach residents and visitors – family pictures with the trees as a background, marriage proposals on the Gondolas, and the fun of being on the Second Street bridge every Thanksgiving to watch them light up.

Little did Long Beach resident Don May know, when in 1949 he floated a real Christmas tree into Alamitos Bay – and then lit it up - that 66 years later there would be over 70 wooden replicas of his original in 11 locations: not only in Alamitos Bay (upper and lower), but the Colorado Lagoon; Peninsula; Spinnaker Bay; Belmont Veterans Memorial Pier; 2nd Street; El Dorado, Heartwell, and Scherer Parks; and downtown at the Rainbow Lagoon.

In 1953, the first of today's familiar triangular shaped wooden structures was used instead of a live tree, its glorious lighting reflecting in the waters of the bay. Operated by the City of Long Beach, the Trees in the Bay program is today supported by donations to Partners of Parks from five community associations and by Tidelands funds.

The "Trees" have been through some rough patches though. In the 70's, during the energy crisis and city budget cuts, the "Trees" were not seen floating in the bay. To the rescue came a local group committed to bringing back the "Trees" using private funding. The original grass-roots committee, headed by Belmont Shore resident Marlene Middough, helped to re-start launch of the "Trees" in Alamitos Bay by forming a foundation and setting out decorated donation cans in Belmont Shore shops. Through bake sales,

garage sales and posted flyers, the group has been able to send money to city departments responsible for the "Trees" annual program. Marlene's daughter, Pamela King, has carried on her mother's legacy and will gratefully accept donations to help offset costs to the city. These costs – about \$2,000 per tree, include transporting, storing, lighting and maintenance. About 10 trees a year need to be replaced. Donations can be sent to Pamela at 67 Pomona Ave, LB, 90803.

I started making my replica "Trees in the Bay" when a friend sent me a Christmas package of all things "Seattle." She included smoked salmon from Pike's Market, salt water taffy, a beautiful ornament and of course, coffee. I wanted to send something that represented Long Beach but couldn't find anything. Racking my brain for Long Beach icons, the "Trees" were my first thought. Being crafty, I hunted down supplies and made about 30



"Tree" ornaments which I gave to family and friends as presents and hostess gifts at holiday parties. They LOVED them and encouraged me to make more the next year. One friend and local real estate broker, Keith Muirhead, has given over 200 ornaments to clients and participants of his Naples Christmas Toy Drive. Naturally, the tabletop versions with real Christmas lights were the next step. Please see the photo and contact info on page 25 if you are interested.

I think Don May would be pleased to see how much launching his first tree became a fond symbol of our fine city. His "Trees in the Bay" live on in Long Beach and grace our homes and hearts as well.

This year's Belmont Shore Christmas Parade theme is "Miracle on 2nd St."

But is that a theme or a description of the parade itself? There are different types of miracles, and they vary in importance, but what is a miracle at its core? Something unexpected? Something great? Something you have to believe in?

When John Morris, founder (and current co-owner) of Legends Sports Bar, started the Christmas Parade in 1982, he certainly didn't expect it to become the holiday tradition it is today. "I was just trying to drum up business for 2nd street." And in typical John Morris fashion, he dove in head first, letting everyone else catch up to his vision.

You may not know Morris, but you've probably heard of him. You've certainly heard of the legacy he's left in Long Beach over his continuing career. Like the Belmont Shore Christmas parade he started 33 years ago - with no funding, no precedent, no nothing but belief and drive.

But that's not all he's started in Long Beach ... in fact the list is too long for now - and not completely relevant in our Christmas issue. The New Year's Eve party on Pine, the Fireworks on the Bay July 3rd, The Summer and Music Concerts ... and many other East Long Beach traditions you hold dear as part of your annual Long Beach routine. Those other traditions can (and will) fill other magazines. For now, the Christmas Parade.

Legends funded the first couple of events. John remembers spending the entirety of the first parade at the starting line, on the corner of Livingston and 2nd St., organizing and directing the participants. Schools, businesses, organizations. The same local Long Beach flavor you will see this year at the Christmas Parade, but instead of over 100 participants, there were roughly 15. Yet those 15 kept John Morris busy. They had never done this before, remember?

So he set them up, gave them instructions, and put them on their way. Next thing he knew, the parade was almost over and he hadn't seen any of it. The Santa Claus that year, and for many years after, was played by Mason Kight. John says Mason was a big ole, jolly attorney whom everyone knew around town. As John was preparing Mason—dressed as Santa Claus—for the final entry on fire truck, Mason said, "John you better get up here and take a look at 2nd Street."

So John climbed up on the fire truck and was shocked to see the street was completely lined with families! John and Mason were thrilled and astonished at the turnout. It may have been only one or two rows deep, but people had actually come out to watch!

How times have changed. These days the annual Christmas Parade brings out so many, there is hardly room between the street and brick-and-mortar small businesses that are still the lifeblood of the Belmont Shore shopping district. 2nd Street is such a bustle of activity, it sometimes seems like the whole community is present.



School bands march through the streets playing holiday carols and rousing fight songs. Representatives from all sorts of local groups, big and small, travel on floats or by foot, waving to onlookers who sit or stand, warm coffees and sweet pastries in hand, scenting the usually brisk night air. And of course there is always the ceremonial finish, with Santa Claus riding in on the big red firetruck. It's the perfect way to demonstrate Long Beach's "small town feel" to an outsider.

Another thing that hasn't changed: "From the beginning and for the 10 years that I ran it, I made sure that the Christmas Parade was first and foremost about the kids," says John Morris.

John says the goal during the first decade was always to make the parade bigger and better. Now he says it has probably gotten as big as it can ever be. The streets are packed and participation is booming. Now, all John and anyone else can do is sit back and enjoy the community.

No one expected the Belmont Shore Christmas Parade, but John Morris believed in it. Now I think we can all agree with this year's theme, Miracle on 2nd Street. We hope to see you this December 5th at 6 pm to witness an East Long Beach holiday tradition!



The Naples Island Boat Parade takes place this year at 6pm on Dec. 12th.

The first parade was held in 1946, and I was there, although not too cognizant at 11 months of age. As a result of that happenstance, I have always been involved and even presided as "commodore" a few times. The parade began in the canals and expanded to include all of Alamitos Bay. Although it appears to run smoothly, there have been a few mishaps, such as the time a Polish training ship entered the large boat parade and sailed right up the jetty from the ocean. It got stuck in the entrance, thus blocking the entry of all other large boats. Apparently they don't read the tide charts in Poland.

On one occasion the parade was underway and the fellow portraying Santa Claus had to make an unscheduled "pit stop" at one of the homes on the bay. As he ran to the bathroom, one of the little children followed him in and moments later ran out yelling, "He is real! He is!" Sometimes proof is presented in strange ways.

The traffic on the night of the parade once delayed Mayor Beverly O'Neill from getting to the dock on time for loading. Ever true to her commitments, the Mayor made a mid-Bay transfer from motor boat to a wobbly gondola, then continued her parade appearance with no spectators the wiser.

We always enjoyed a great effort from Gondola Getaway, but on one occasion when my wife was president, we got aboard the gondola and the novice gondolier asked whether anyone was in front of him as he had dropped his glasses overboard. He then wondered whether we knew the route because he didn't. After the trip around the canal, he began to row us back to LBYC when he dropped one of his oars into the bay. The large boats didn't recognize our SOS with a flashlight, so they

honked and wished us a Merry Christmas as we sat grounded on a sandy spit. Luckily Officer Marcia Rhone got worried when we didn't return to the club, and sent a motor boat out for us. Since we both could swim, we considered abandoning ship, but were rescued in time to keep our clothes dry.

An enormously popular entry was the Wilson High School band with drummers. As I was responsible for the safety of all the entrants, I panicked when the parade ended and we couldn't locate the band. They finally turned up across the bay by one of the restaurants, not having contacted anyone in our committee. They had jettisoned a rented generator which was never found.

Each year presents a different challenge, but the parade must be blessed by sanction from a higher power, because even when it would sprinkle every year up until parade time, we have never been rained upon in almost 70 years.



Thousands of years ago, a child lying in a manger brought people together. And today, a Christmas pageant entitled "Portraits of the Prince of Peace," is bringing together the East Long Beach community and Christian parishioners from different denominations to celebrate Jesus' birth.

Six Long Beach churches located on Wardlow Road present the 43rd annual event that features "live portraits" depicting the chronology of the birth of Jesus Christ. The churches participating are the following: The Neighborhood Church, St. Luke's Lutheran, University Baptist, St. Cornelius Catholic, Long Beach Christian Reformed and Calvary Chapel of Long Beach.

"We are very fortunate in East Long Beach to have a lot of churches, especially those housed close by each other, and this is a unique opportunity for all of the denominations to come together and participate in an event that celebrates the true meaning of Christmas," says St. Cornelius representative Ed Gingras.

The pageant walk, located on Wardlow Road at Bellflower Blvd., is open to the public and is free of charge. The Pageant will be held nightly, from 7:30 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. on Dec. 11, 12, and 13. "The walk covers everything," Gingras says. "Starting with the Three Wise Men to the journey to Bethlehem, to the birth of Christ, each scene depicts a significant biblical message."

The candle-lit journey begins at the corner of Bellflower Boulevard and Wardlow Road near St. Cornelius. In front of St. Cornelius will be a sign with the famous prophecy from Isaiah

9:6: "For unto us a child is born, unto us a son is given, and the government will be on his shoulders. And he will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace."

The Prince of Peace Pageant continues on the south side of Wardlow to San Anseline, where the Neighborhood Church is located. Walk west along Wardlow to St. Luke's and the Long Beach Christian Reformed Church, leading to additional biblical scenes with real actors and live animals.

"We have sheep, goats, ponies," Gingras says. "It's truly spectacular." University Baptist Church and Calvary Chapel of Long Beach round out the field for this year's Prince of Peace Pageant, an event started in 1972 by Pastor Roger Magnuson of St. Luke's



Lutheran church. Magnuson started the outdoor pageant in response to the commercialization of Christmas. And today, bringing together the East Long Beach community and its clergy to celebrate the true meaning of Christmas continues to be the main goal.


"It's strictly a community event that is focused on the religious aspect of Christmas and the birth of Christ," Gingras says. "The pageant is put on for people to receive the message of Christmas. In this day and age, where everything is 'buy this, and buy that' the true meaning of Christmas can get lost very easily."

The Portraits of the Prince of Peace Pageant is completely non-profit and presented solely through volunteer effort. The pageant's "live statues," for example, are all actors mostly recruited from the churches' congregations. The only characters that move are the Three Wise Men, who greet people at the start of the pageant walk. Then, as if looking at a painting or a statue, live actors pose motionless in 22 different biblical scenes.

"This is something where people can comfortably stroll in the winter air and go from church to church," Gingras says, adding that people can go inside each church as well to enjoy music. "Sit down in the pews and reflect, listen to the soothing music, or just enjoy the evening," he says.

In front of Long Beach Christian Reform, there is a small stage where a choir will be singing Christmas carols. It all culminates in front of University Baptist, where the manger scene is located. If preferred, people can enjoy the pageant from their cars by driving down Wardlow to enjoy the spectacle.

Each year, the Wardlow Road church community works together to make this expanded nativity a reality. For its members, like St. Luke's church representative Bob Erickson, the Portraits





of the Prince of Peace Pageant is a rarity.

"Not many places put on a big nativity like this," says Erickson, who is on the church committee that organizes the pageant. And the fact that the pageant has only grown over its four decades in existence is another miraculous aspect of the event, according to Erickson. "Not much has changed since the beginning," he says. "We've remodeled the pageant sets, but the spirit has stayed constant."

St. Luke's displays a dreaming Joseph, who is visited by an Angel to deliver the message of Christ's birth. The church additionally has an exhibit of

Caesar Augustus calling for the census that led to Joseph and Mary's journey to Bethlehem.

But for Erickson, perhaps the most unique aspect about the Portraits of the Prince of Peace Pageant is its ability to bring people together around the holidays to celebrate a shared ideal.

"It's six separate church denominations coming together to celebrate the true meaning of Christmas," he says. "Everybody is welcome at the pageant."

Whether in a Bethlehem cave thousands of years ago, or in a balmy Long Beach suburb, the birth of the Christ child always brings people together.



Long Beach Celebrates The Eight Crazy Nights of Chanukah

As is its annual tradition, Shul By The Shore plans on celebrating with a large community festive Hanukkah event on Sunday afternoon, December 6 in Belmont Shore next to Citibank. Hanukkah (sometimes spelled "Chanukah") is a holiday that celebrates religious freedom, a concept near and dear to the core essence of the United States.

Typically occurring in and around December, the actual date wobbles a bit due to the lunar Jewish calendar but always falls somewhat close to Christmas. The holiday has adopted some elements of a Jewish Christmas with the focus on sharing gifts with children. A very festive holiday, it features the Jewish donut, the sufganiyah (pictured above). Hanukkah is a wildly popular holiday in Long Beach and across the country and there will be hundreds, if not thousands, of free sufganiyah donuts being given out to everyone at the Belmont Shore event, which takes place on the first night of this eight day holiday.

The holiday is celebrated by lighting the menorah every night for eight consecutive days. One of the purposes of Menorah lighting is to publicize the miracle to one's family because every generation needs to be reminded of the miracles that God has performed in the past and continuing to the present day.

The miracle of Hanukkah is that after the Maccabean revolt liberated the Holy Temple (the Second Temple) in Jerusalem from the Greeks, its rededication was stifled as the only oil the Jews could find upon their return was enough to keep the eternal flame lit for just one day.

However, that canister of oil miraculously ended up keeping the eternal flame illuminated for eight days, providing sufficient time to have more oil brought up to Jerusalem in the Judean Hills, and the eternal flame thus burned without interruption. Every synagogue has an eternal flame which symbolizes God's eternal presence, intended never to be extinguished.

All local Long Beach Hanukkah candle lighting events are open to the entire community, including the daily public candle lighting that will take place every afternoon of the holiday at the Alpert JCC on Willow Street.

Fighting the Good F

Pastor Brad Paradee

A historic boxing match changed everything for Pastor Brad Paradee. The Long Beach First Church of the Nazarene's new pastor said he grew up going to church, but fell away from the faith when he was a teenager. He vowed he would never go back to church again, lamenting that people in church were nothing but crazy and judgmental.

Then he married wife Susan. She started telling Brad that he needed to accept Jesus as his Lord and Savior and that he should come to church with her. But Brad wanted nothing to do with church or God.

That all changed on February 11, 1990. It was 9 a.m. that Sunday and Mike Tyson entered the boxing ring as the undefeated heavyweight champion of the world. He figuratively towered over his opponent in Goliath-like proportions. Tyson faced 42-1 longshot Buster Douglas that day. Brad, a fervent boxing fan and Tyson supporter, set up his big screen television outside in the backyard to watch the fight.

"I'll make you a bet," Susan said to Brad. "If Tyson loses, you're coming to church with me today."

Brad accepted his wife's challenge, but only on the condition that if The Champ won, Susan would never mention church or God to him again.

After 10 grueling rounds, Douglas knocked out Tyson in what would become one of the biggest boxing upsets of all time. Brad lost the bet, so he went to church with his wife.

"It was like coming home," Brad said about his first experience back at church in years. He gave his life to



Jesus and soon after, began his pastoral ministry.

"So when people ask me how I became a pastor, I say, 'I lost a bet,'" Brad says.

Pastor Brad began his ministry in his native Illinois. He soon received the opportunity to pastor a church in Lake Havasu City, Arizona, where he served as the Associate Pastor and Youth Pastor. While there, Pastor Brad became instrumental in growing the church's youth ministry and also started a homeless shelter for the city. Most recently, Pastor Brad served as senior pastor at Chapel Hill Church in Brighton, Colorado. Now he leads The Long Beach First Church of the Nazarene and will look to use his experiences to help grow and revitalize the church located on Clark Avenue.

"Our congregation is really excited about him," says church administrator Wes Sullivan.

Among Brad's strengths as a church leader is cultivating hope, especially within the homeless community and with young people. "I understand what it means to be broken hearted," Brad says. "A lot of young people feel beat down and lost. I want to help lift them up." Brad will organize a new homeless

ministry at the church called PATH—People Assisting the Homeless. Brad would also like to minister to the war veterans at the VA Hospital as part of his community outreach.

And The Long Beach First Church of the Nazarene will continue its "Jazz at the Naz" concert to lift spirits and welcome new visitors. For the last 10 years, the church has hosted a concert featuring lively tunes from the Big Band Era. Several of the church's members are musicians in the band who play in the Big Swing Band at El Dorado Park. The concert takes place every third Saturday of the month at the church.

The church will also host "Seventh Day Slumber" and "Disciple," two of five bands on the Rock City Fest Tour. The bands are scheduled to play on March 4, 2016 at "The Naz." "This church is looking to grow with the millennial generation," Pastor Brad says, adding that he hopes he can help young people find hope and faith like he did.

"I'm just a normal guy who found God," he says. Pastor Brad hopes he can lead people to God and foster a renewed love for church—a place Brad almost didn't find. But Mike Tyson lost his fight and now Pastor Brad is fighting the good fight.







CHRISTMAS AND HAPPY NEW YEAR FROM LOS ALTOS

The Story of a Los Altos Holiday Greeting

When Bob Soukup (pictured above) moved into his Chatwin Avenue home overlooking Whaley Park, he was puzzled. Why was there a big plywood cutout of the letter "P" sitting in his garage? Soukup threw it away, and never really discovered the story behind the novelty looking "P" cutout.

Not until very recently. When Bob registered for the social network, "Nextdoor Los Altos," he asked his neighbors if any of them could tell him what that letter "P" stood for.

He got an answer. In the early 1950s, all the houses surrounding Whaley Park participated in a holiday greeting, where each house put out one plywood cutout letter. When evenings came during the Christmas season, the Whaley Park houses lit up, spelling out, "M-E-R-R-Y C-H-R-I-S-T-M-A-S" and "H-A-P-P-Y N-E-W Y-E-A-R." Back in the day, Bob's letter "P" had once been used as the first "P" in the word "Happy."

Decades have passed and the Whaley Park holiday greeting tradition is a faded memory. Most of the letters used in spelling out the holiday greeting are long gone, and the people who started that tradition have left the Los Altos area.

However, Soukup's next door neighbor, Jane Barrett, remains from the generation that put out the Whaley Park holiday greeting. She moved into her cozy house on Chatwin Avenue in 1948. When she participated in the Whaley Park greeting, the now 94-year-old recalls her house held up the letter "A" in "Happy New Year."

"The people living across the street, on the other side of Whaley Park, put up 'Merry Christmas,' so the people living on my block decided we would put up 'Happy New Year," remembers Barrett.

What better way to greet the holidays than with a little friendly neighborhood lights competition?

And the tradition was indeed friendly. Barrett recalls people from the Whaley Park neighborhood also organized a holiday picnic to go along with the festive decorative greeting.

"There was a group of us that used to have a meal in the Whaley Park clubhouse," she says. "We'd take our own food over there and have lunch. It was like a community picnic." In those days, the housing market was booming. Barrett served in the United States Army in World War II. She, like many others in that generation, was ready to settle down in a nice neighborhood after the war.

Developer Lloyd Whaley sold more than 11,000 new homes in Long Beach during the '40s and '50s. He also donated a dozen acres to a place that became known as "Whaley Park."

"Seemingly every day you'd wake up and look out the window and there'd be another string of new houses in the area," Barrett says.

As families piled into the emerging neighborhood, so did the babies. Pretty soon, Barrett recalls, there were kids running around all over Whaley Park at the time of the holiday greeting tradition.

"We'd turn on the Christmas lights, and the kids would roam around and play," Barrett says.

Those kids have long since grown up. But in the year 2015, Barrett says her block has welcomed four newborn babies. With talk of starting the holiday greeting tradition again, perhaps by the time those babies are ready to play in the Whaley Park neighborhood, a brand new set of letters will spell out a holiday greeting for them to enjoy.



The oldest Long Beach Christmas traditions—just in case you were wondering—of course date to the era of the Spanish ranchos in this area. The early settlers would gather round a piñata hanging from the ceiling, not a Christmas tree. On Christmas Eve, after taking turns using a long stick to smash the clay jar filled with candy and gifts, the community would then attend Las Posadas (the Pageant of the Holy Family) at the nearby Mission followed by Midnight Mass.

When Americans from the East Coast started to settle in the ranchos, they brought the Christmas tree traditions with which we are more familiar. Though John and Susan Bixby were the first American couple to own Rancho Los Alamitos up on Bixby Hill (at the end of Palo Verde and Anaheim near CSULB), the first real memorable Bixby Christmas traditions belonged to their son Fred and his wife Florence and their annual Christmas Eve parties from 1906 until the 1930s.

Everyone attended the parties. Hundreds of people. Which was literally everyone in East Long Beach at the time. Before the housing tracts, schools, and streets; the 90808, 90815, and 90803 zip codes; this area was all part of the Bixby ranch. The ranch hands and their families made the trek up Bixby Hill every Christmas Eve from houses scattered around the area. They wouldn't miss it for anything. It was the party of the year. They came even in the rain. One year a woman sat quietly in the corner all during the party

without talking. The Bixby family would later find out she was hours away from giving birth. But missing the Bixby Christmas Party was out of the question.

The Christmas tree was unique at the Bixby house. It was always cut off on the top. Fred Bixby was a big man and he was "El Patron." The Boss. Naturally he wanted the biggest Christmas tree in the area with the biggest branches. For the tree to have the girth Fred wanted, it was always too tall to fit below their ceiling. So they cut it off at the top. No Christmas star topped this tree. It looked like it was growing through the roof.

The living room was blocked off with hanging bed sheets so that no one could see the Christmas tree until after dinner. Under the tree sat hundreds of presents - one for each family and two for each child. And these weren't just fly-by-night gifts like the desperation buys some of us make at Target on December 23rd. The Bixby gift-buying process started the day after Thanksgiving.

The Bixby children would ride out to every single ranch house, and survey their families. Lists would be compiled. Each year the families would get something they needed – either for their homes, or tailored perfectly to the ages and sexes of their children. Florence Bixby spent long days in Los Angeles shopping for meaningful gifts. It was important that the gifts weren't generic.



When the bed sheets were finally taken down and the massive, fully decorated Christmas tree was revealed, the crowd was enthralled. No one could quite believe the sight of this sparkling, ornate wonder. Lit candle were clipped to the ends of all the branches and illuminated the mounds of presents underneath. It seemed too good to be true—to the ranch hands who saw it every year, and even the Bixby family who had decorated it the night before.

So it seems, there was nothing quite like those Christmas Eves at the Bixby Ranch in the early 1900s. East Long Beach may have been more rural than it is now. But even before cars, streets, and cell phones tying us together 24/7, the Bixby holiday tradition made the 5 miles surrounding Rancho Los Alamitos seem a lot smaller and more closely knit than the reality. No one was thinking about distance. The rancho community was thinking about friends, families, and co-workers – those familiar faces and traditions that still give our 908' community its small town feel today.

If you and your family would like to experience early Long Beach Christmas traditions, the historic Rancho Los Alamitos ranch house will be fully decorated for the holidays beginning November 28 and open for tours Wednesday



through Sunday from 1-5:00 p.m. free of charge. Rancho Los Alamitos hosts a breakfast with Santa on Dec. 12 from 9am-noon. Evening tours on Dec. 17, 18, and 19 from 4-8:00 p.m are available by reservation at the Rancho's annual Christmas Open House. (\$5 suggested donation per family.) For Hills, playing Santa provides an opportunity to make children smile. "I had a little gentleman one year say, 'You're not the real Santa, you're fake.' I









Hi Stacie and Barbara, can you briefly describe Back to Basics Learning Programs?

Back to Basics is about education, helping parents to help their kids, without breaking the budget. It can get expensive, especially if you have more than one child. Being parents ourselves, we know firsthand how expensive it can be; also how important a child's education and success is! We both worked for the Long Beach Unified School District, which is how and where we met. We saw and spoke to many parents who were just like us. So we wanted to create a space for kids to come, and yet be as affordable as possible!

What is your Philosophy on educating children?

We are more than just academics. We get to know our students on a personal level. Who they are, what they like, and how they feel. Are they shy, do they lack confidence? Are they unorganized? These things can disturb and disrupt learning. We get to know the families and work as a team. We aren't a one size fits all center. No guarantees, no frills, nothing fancy. We will do all we can though to match your child with an instructor who can best help; using their education, knowledge, and skills. In other words, we look at the whole picture and devise an individual plan! We let parents know up front that it takes time and won't happen over night.

What prompted you to start this business?

We've known each other for a long time. We knew our ideas about education were similar. We saw some of the same things going on in the schools that we didn't like. There were changes happening, programs being cut, less help available for struggling students. Parents were concerned but didn't know what to do. Technology was also changing things and becoming more popular. It wasn't always available nor affordable. We saw that before you could master technology, before you could dream any dream, you need to learn the basics. Read and write, pencil and paper!

In 2008, we were working together; teaching 3, 4, and 5 year olds. We were at Bolivar Park, which is where we started creating other classes that we could offer our families. We were also tutoring out of various libraries. We hauled our books and materials back and forth between places and kids. This got old, fast!

We started talking about getting our own place. Setting down roots somewhere so we could really expand. Parents asked for more help, extra classes, more available hours. They wanted somewhere they could take all of their kids, but we were limited. We began to look for a place to grow and expand!

In 2011, we found Parkview Village; it was beautiful and located near parks, schools, and a library. We opened in October of



that year. Now we're going into our 5th year and thriving! We have 2 suites, several capable and talented instructors, and wonderful families that we have gotten to know, along with a great following! (Many whom we've known since 2008 and earlier.)

What makes you different from other tutoring places/schools?

Here we don't have contracts so parents aren't locked into a yearlong commitment, but a monthly one. We understand that people have lives and need to be flexible.

We find out what their kids' issues are and start at grade level, working forward, or backward, depending on the needs of the individual child. Each student stays with their instructor the whole time- all of this while working closely with the teacher, school communication websites, and the child's personality. We are family oriented and our main focus is on the child.

We are growing with the times. We have expanded to meet the learners in all subjects ages 3 to grade 12. We help kids with their iPad programs, but before we do, we make sure they know how to handle a pencil and paper first!

What is the best part about owning your own business?

Seeing the success of students we work with. Seeing growth. We have students still with us who were 3 and 4 years old and are now in 3rd grade or older! We have family connections and are a part of their activities outside of Back to Basics.




